# Insurance & Billing

- The Student Health Fee helps ensure students have access to affordable primary care, emergency response, health education, and campus-wide public health services that keep them healthy and supported throughout their time at Florida State
- We bill insurance for most services; co-pays are not collected at the visit
- Any remaining balance after insurance is billed to your student account
- We are in-network with many insurance plans. If your plan is out-of-network, charges not covered by your insurance will be posted to your student account.
- Out-of-network for AvMed and Tricare Prime
- Health insurance is required; a university plan is available
- Bridge of care options
- Emergency Room care is for true emergencies and is not a substitute for primary or specialty care

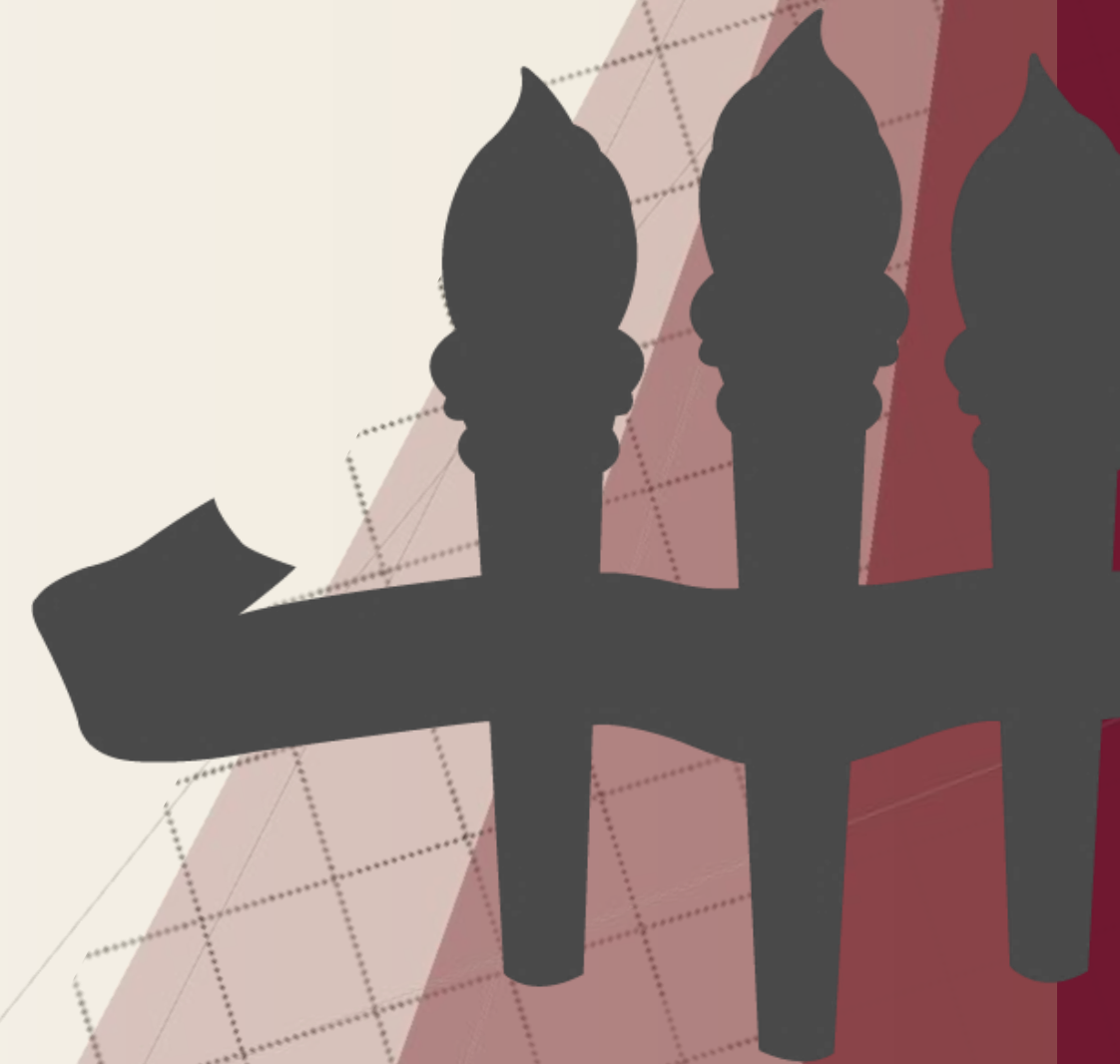
# What are COGS Conference Grants?

**Financial support for graduate students so they can attend conferences, present research, and represent Florida State University to the national and international academic community.**

**There are two different types of grants you can apply for:  
Attendance and Presentation Grants.**

**These grants are made available on a first come first serve basis, which means that you may not get your application approved if funding has run out for time period you applied during.**

**All requests must be submitted 15 business days prior but funds are disbursed as a reimbursement to students who completes all requirements.**

July 1-October 31

November 1-February 29

March 1-June 30

## Earliest time you can apply:

June 1

October 1

February 1

# How much can I get?

## Attendance Grants:

Any location more than 100 miles from Florida State University: **\$200**

## Presentation Grants:

Outside U.S. (foreign countries not including Alaska, Hawaii): **\$700**

Within the U.S. (>100 miles from Florida State University): **\$350**

## Combined Grant:

One Conference You Are Presenting At For the Whole Year: **\$600**

**The maximum awarded amount in travel grants for any given student is**

**\$700 in any single fiscal year.**

**You are limited to 2 grants per fiscal year.**

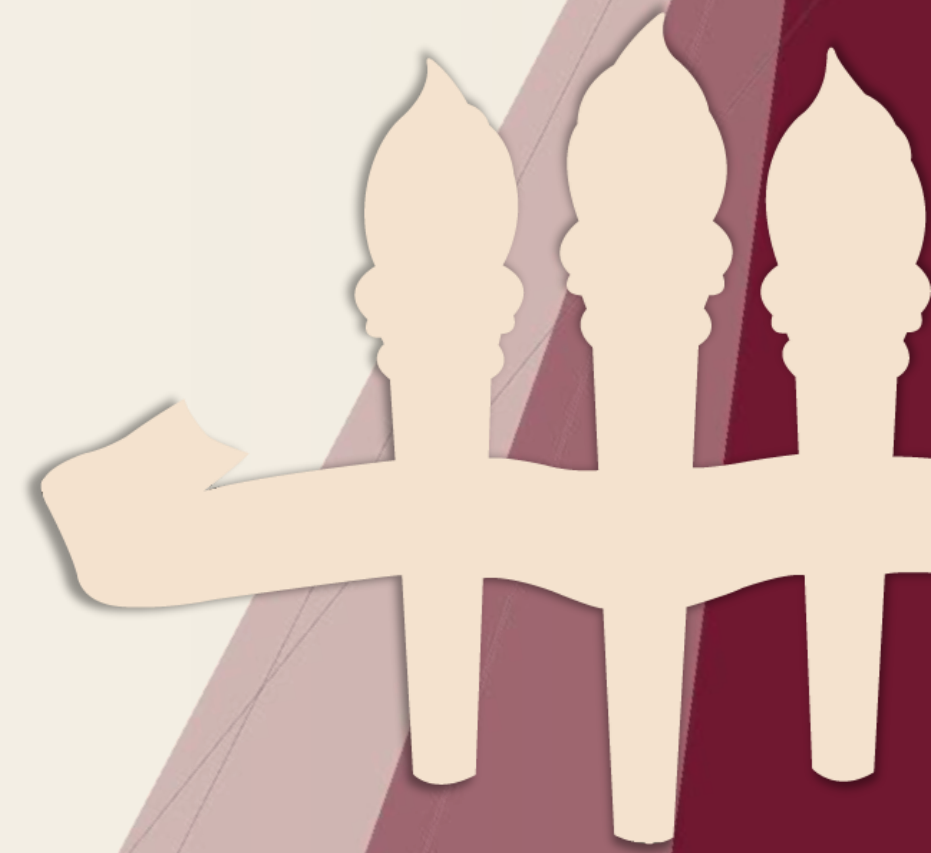
# What happens after submitting your application?

- COGS Deputy Speaker of Finance will either approve or deny your application based on if you meet all requirements for the grant being applied to and type of travel
- You should receive an email from SurveyMonkey letting you know that your application was approved or denied

# Other important points of information

- Note: You should complete a travel authorization form before your conference.
  - Departments might have their own process and unique form with this, so talk with your department's travel representative.
  - This being done before your travel allows for a faster reimbursement.
- Even if you are not awarded the grant, you should continue to work with your travel representative.

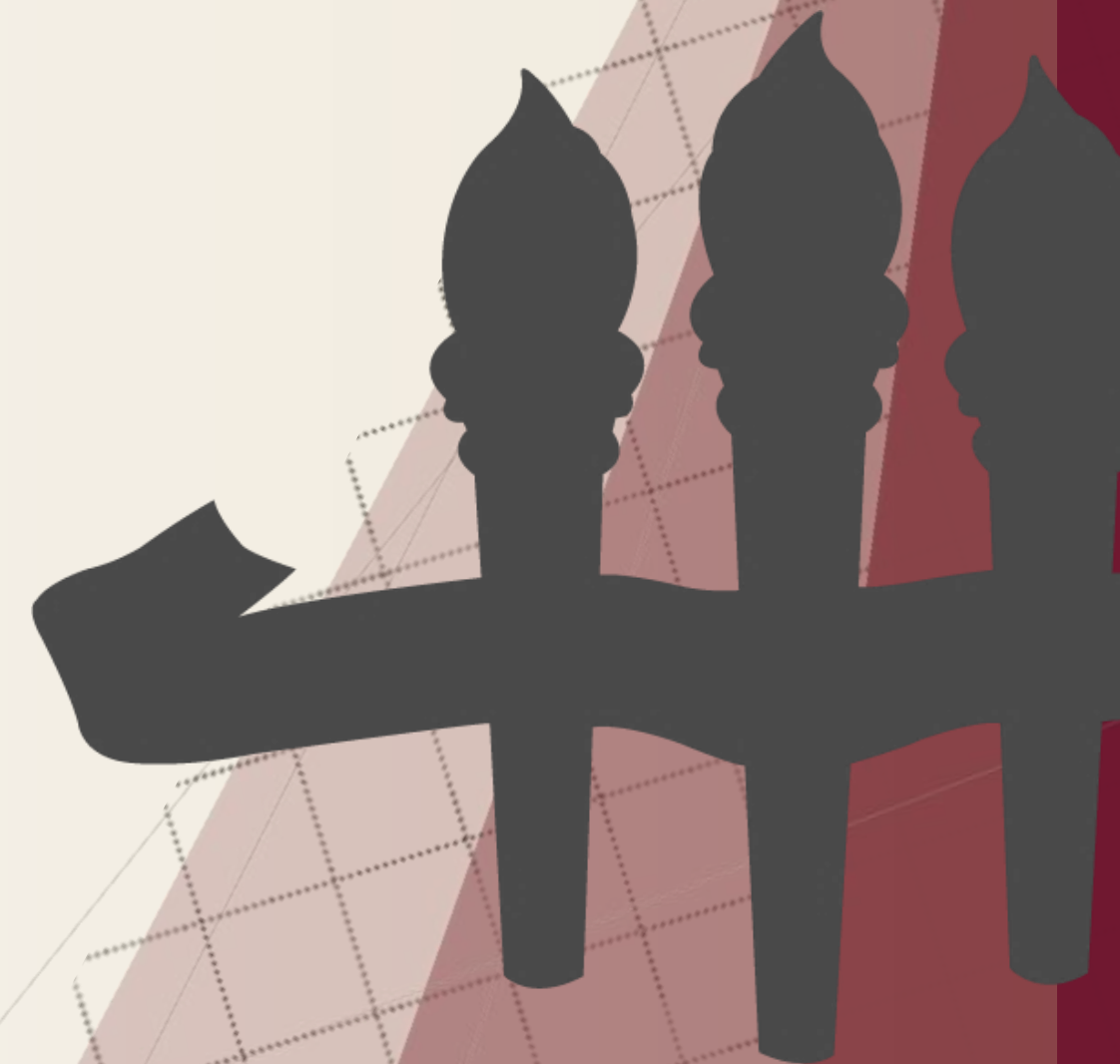


# After approval

No longer need to communicate with COGS

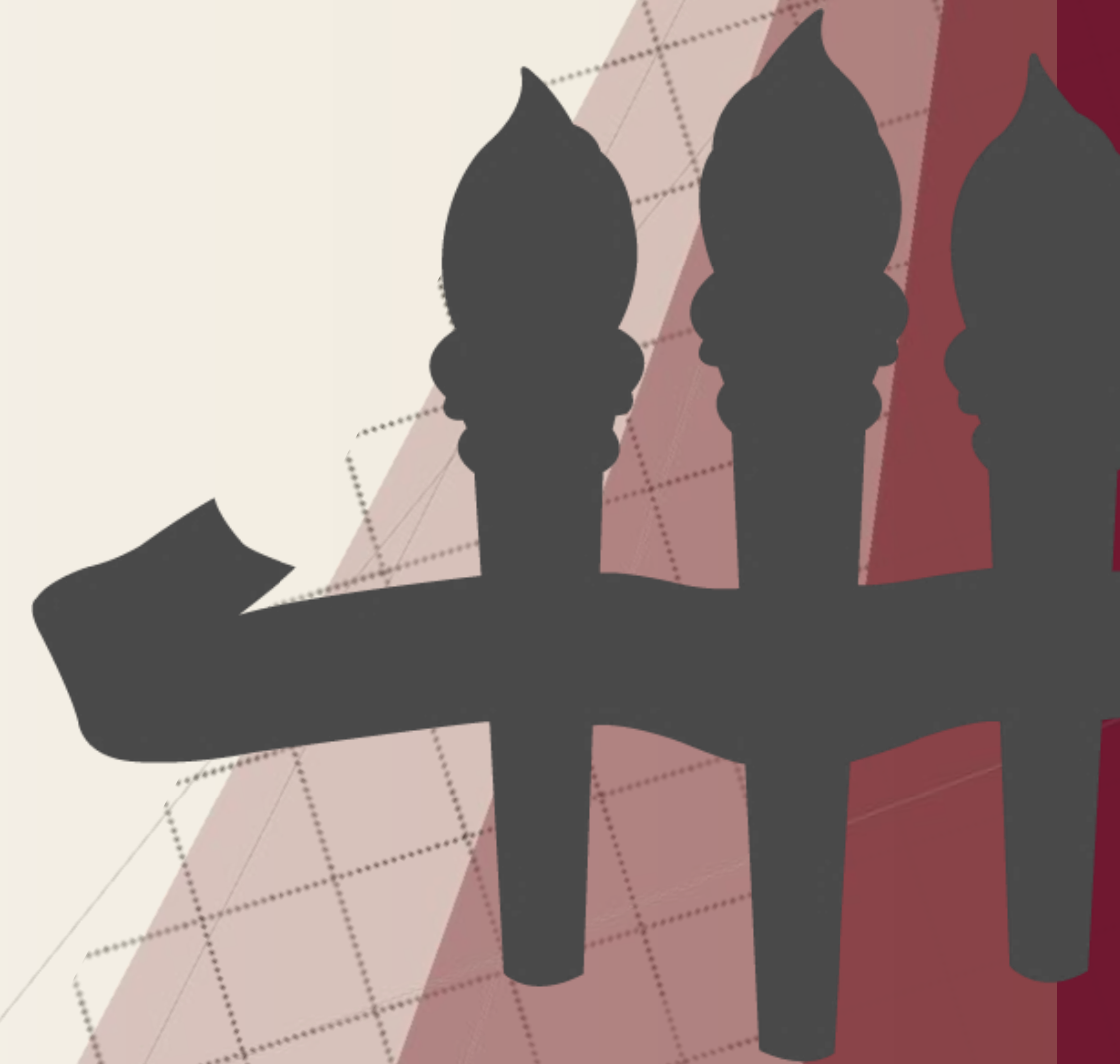
- Save all receipts from your travel
- Receipts must include: Date of Purchase Reprinted vendor name and address Billing information Details (Showing approved student receiving the grant as the payee)

Expenses that Can Be Reimbursed: Conference Registration Fees, Hotel/Lodging, Airfare, Map Mileage (if personal vehicle was used), Ground Transportation (Uber, Lyft, Taxi, etc) Parking Fees, Baggage Fees, Rental Car Fees (Please speak with your travel representative prior to reserving).



# After approval

- Within 30 days of coming back, work with your department's travel representative to build an expense report through Concur
  - You will send them the approval from COGS
  - Receipts
  - Program from conference
- How do you know who your travel representative is?
  - Usually have the title of administrative assistant/associate
  - Handle travel for all faculty, staff, and students in your department, so ask others
- Reach out to us if they need the budget code for the attendance or presentation grant

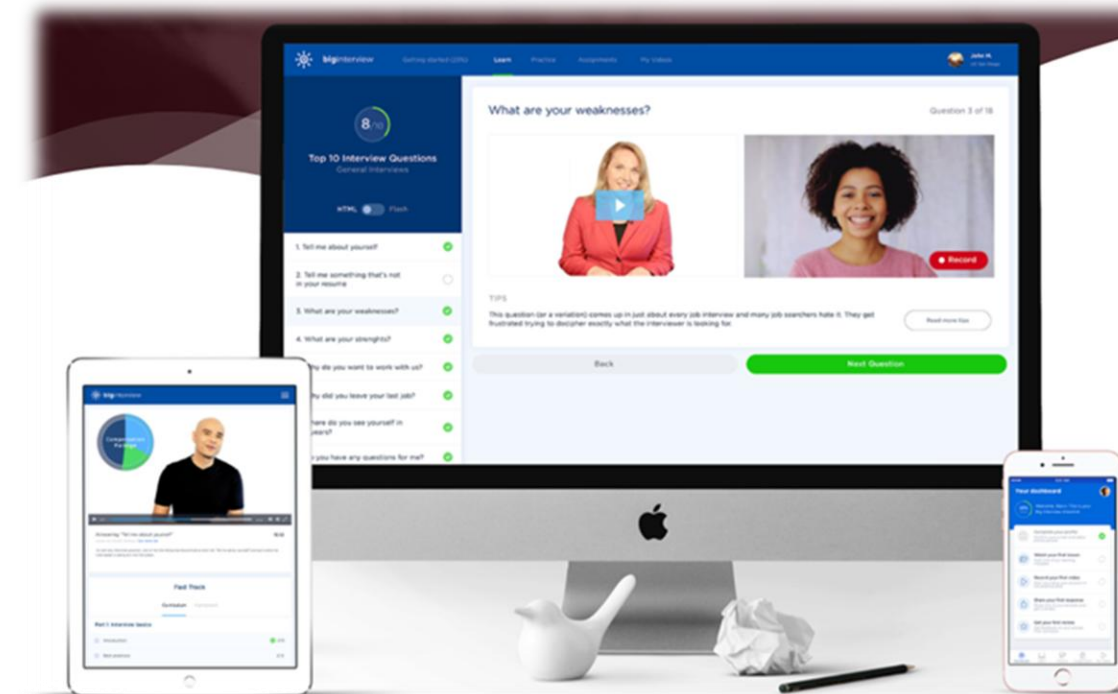


Self-Knowledge--CIP Pyramid.

# Mission Statement

The Student Ombuds Office is committed to fulfilling Florida State University's mission by cultivating a campus climate grounded in respect, honesty, and integrity. As an independent, informal, impartial, and confidential resource, the Student Ombuds Office serves students by offering a safe place to seek counsel, obtain resources, and ask questions about FSU policy. The Student Ombuds Office welcomes all visitors from the FSU student body.

# Services

- **Objective:** Provide students with the resources & skills to advocate for themselves.
  
- **Clarify the student ombuds' role & explain the cornerstone principles.**
  - **Confidentiality:** Circumstances will not be disclosed without the visitor's consent, absent compelling reasons (e.g., court order/Title IX).
  - **Informality:** May not overturn a decision made by faculty/staff.
  - **Impartiality:** May not advocate for students or the university.
  - **Independence:** Independent from any FSU administrative structure.

# Services

- Listen

- Provide a safe environment where students know they will be heard.
- Gather facts to understand the student's circumstances.

- Ask insightful questions

- Ask questions to help the student explain their perspective and priorities.

- Clarify policy and provide options

- Explain university policies, processes, and procedures.
- Present all options to the student.
  - Encourage a discussion of all available options.

# Services

- Assist with decision-making

- Ask the student to re-affirm their priorities and goals.
- Ask additional insightful questions that encourage critical thinking.
- Help students evaluate various options.
- It is the student's responsibility to decide which option to pursue.

- Provide coaching

- Help students prepare to express themselves persuasively & respectfully.
- Role play situations and discuss conflict mitigation.

- Clarify next steps

- Clarify what will happen next and who is responsible for each task.

# Common Issues

- Common issues the Student Ombuds Office can assist with include:
  - Grade Appeals
  - Academic Honor Policy Appeals
  - General Academic Appeals
  - Medical/Mental Health Course Drops & Withdrawals
  - Alleged FERPA Violations

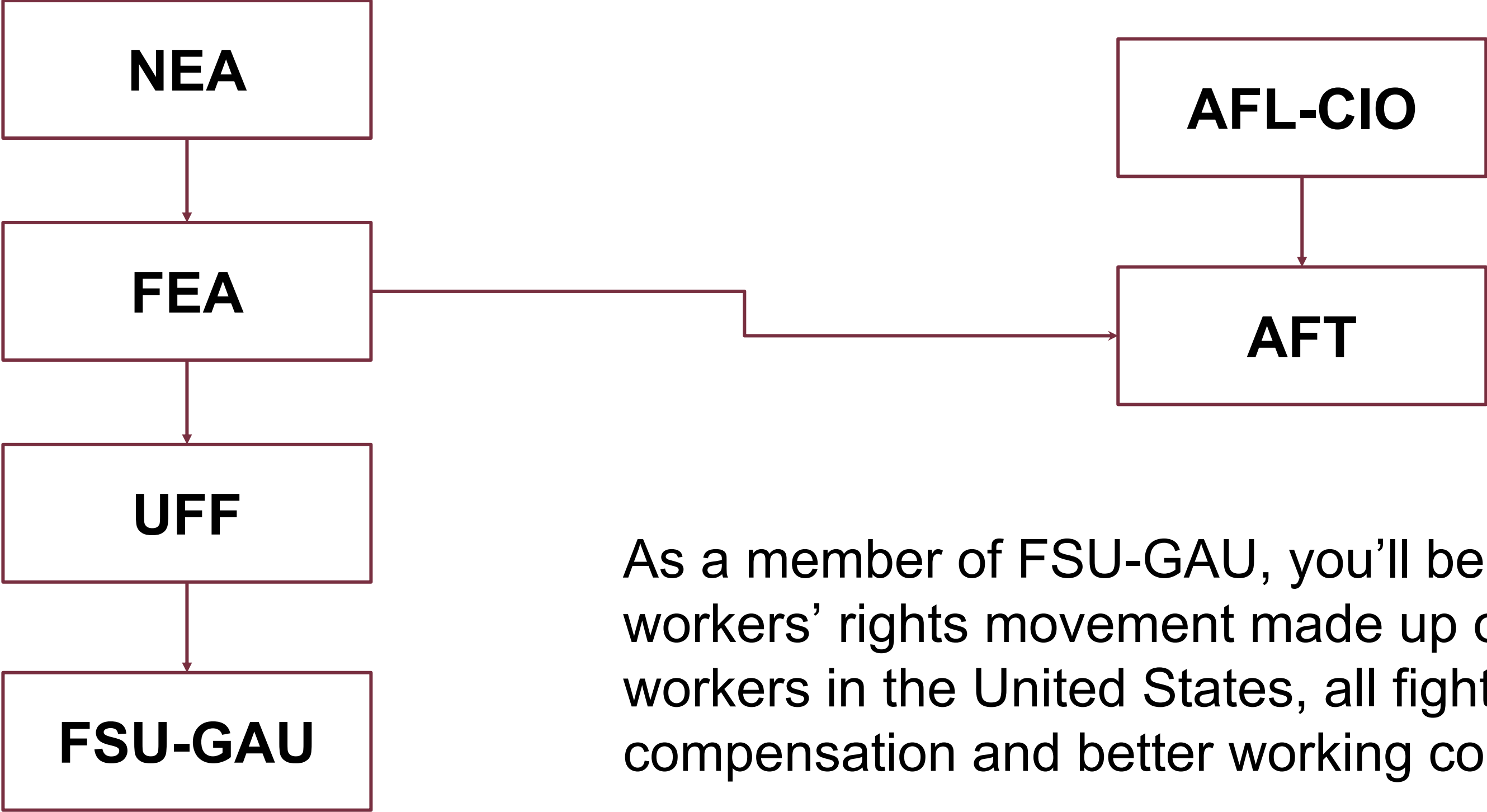

# Who we are and what we do

- **GAU is the sole labor union for all graduate assistants (GAs) at FSU**, including all teaching assistants and research assistants (but not MD and JD students).
- Together, we bargain for:
  - **Better wages**
  - **Better working conditions**
- **and we're responsible for:**
  - **Protecting members' rights**
  - **Contract enforcement**
- Additionally, we:
  - Engage in nonpartisan legislative advocacy
  - Aid community organizations
  - Contribute to the broader labor movement

# Nationwide Solidarity



As a member of FSU-GAU, you'll be a part of a workers' rights movement made up of *millions* of workers in the United States, all fighting for fair compensation and better working conditions.

# Before GAU...

- Before we had a union, compensation for GAs was gut-wrenchingly low:
  - Health insurance lottery
  - No protections from overwork
  - No contract enforcement process
  - No right to collectively bargain (so GAs got wrecked by inflation every year)
- You'll notice that, even today, FSU's management tends to run the university like a for-profit corporation. **They don't give us anything; we have to fight for it, and we're always stronger together.**

# What has GAU done for you?

Here's what we have now compared to GAs 10 years ago:

## 10 years ago

- \$8100 minimum stipend
- \$700/year health insurance premium contribution
- No right to protest factually incorrect evaluations
- No relief from per-credit-hour fees

## Now

- \$18,700 minimum stipend
- \$2359/year health insurance premium contribution
- Right to remove factually incorrect evaluations from student file
- \$500 per year (\$250 for 0.25-time) of fee relief

# What do I get for being a member?

The following benefits are *only available to dues paying members*:

- Contract enforcement through the grievance process
  - This may include:
    - Late or missing paychecks
    - Inappropriate behavior from a supervisor
    - An unsafe workspace
    - Being required to work longer hours than your contract stipulates
  - Simply email [grievance@fsugau.org](mailto:grievance@fsugau.org) to begin the process with our grievance chair
- Participate in socials!
  - We have socials almost every month, where we give GAs free food, drinks, and access to activities like bowling!
- 2 free consultations with a lawyer!
- Discounts on travel/insurance/credit cards through FEA/NEA

# Our Union is in Danger

In 2023 the FL Legislature passed Senate Bill 256/House Bill 1445, which requires all public-employee unions to sign up 60% of the people they represent as dues-paying members. **Failing to meet this threshold could mean the end of the union's ability to protect you and nullify our contract with FSU.**

For us, that's 60% of **~3000 Graduate Assistants.**

**If you choose not to join, you are *choosing* to go back to unfair compensation, no grievance process, and few (if any) contractual protections from harassment and bias.**

# Costs

- Are dues expensive?** Not at all! Dues constitute only 1% of your paycheck.
- Dues usually cost less than \$15 a paycheck, but depends on your stipend!
  - We use FEA eDues, a system that sets up automatic ACH deductions with your bank. Once you've completed the easy setup process, you never have to worry whether you're up-to-date.
  - Canceling is as simple as emailing [membership@fsugau.org](mailto:membership@fsugau.org)
  - Our dues serve our organization and our parents and affiliate organizations. Your money directly contributes to state and nation wide action which benefits all laborers, especially educators. It helps to fund things like lawyers and legislative action, which is becoming increasingly important under the current state and federal administrations.
